FIRST READING Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14 As I watched:

Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames, its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. A court was held and the books were opened. I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him hwas conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.

It was not any cleverly invented myths that we were repeating when we brought you the knowledge of the power and the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ: we had seen his majesty for ourselves. We heard this ourselves, spoken from heaven, when we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have confirmation of what was said in prophecies; and you will be right to depend on prophecy and take it as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark until the dawn comes and the morning star rises in your minds.

VALE MARY KENNEDY

Mary Kennedy was farewelled with a Funeral Mass at St Peter's, Normanville on Monday, 17 July. The celebrant was Fr Josy.

Mary was born on 10 March, 1941 at Dandenong in Victoria, the youngest of Ellen and Mervyn Egerton's six children. Mary and her sister Val (two years older than Mary) first attended St Joseph's Boarding School in Echuca. The trip to Echuca was quite some distance away and the little girls made the journey by steam train. They returned home at the end of each school term.


In 1952 Mary attended Kilbreda College in Mentone and then later, completed a business course at Killester College in Clayton, much nearer home.

Mary worked most of her life in retail, beginning at Georges of Collins Street, Melbourne.

She met Graeme who was 'a wonderful dancer' when she was sixteen, but their relationship didn't really blossom until later, when Graeme was working as a stock agent in Dandenong. They were married on 31 December, 1960 at St Mary's Church Dandenong. Mary was 20 and Graeme 23.

Mary worked in retail until she retired in 2005, managing the household and nurturing the children - Donna (born 1963), Tracey (1965), Ashley (1968) and Simone (1970).

After several moves Mary and Graeme settled in Normanville, where they were both very involved with St Peter's Church. Graeme was the Normanville rep on the PFC at the time Galilee Church was being built



and also devoted an enormous amount of time, energy and hard physical work into the establishment of the Annie O'Connor Centre. He passed away in March, 2012.

Mary had numerous roles at St Peter's - reading, sacristan, etc, but will always be remembered for her amazing organisational skills when it came to community functions in the Annie O'Connor Centre.

She will be very much missed.

EXPLORING THE WORD

In the Hebrew Scriptures high mountains were seen as holy places; places where one could encounter God. It was on the summit of Mt Sinai that Moses received the Law from God's own hand (Ex 19); it was on Mt Horeb that Elijah encountered God in the gentle breeze (1 Kings 19:9). When Jesus takes the three disciples to the top of the mountain, it should come as no surprise that they encounter the glorified divinity of Christ.

In Christ, both the Law, represented by Moses, and the Prophets, represented by Elijah, is fulfilled. This fleeting moment of revelation to the disciples leaves them gasping and speechless. Peter wants to retain the memory of this glimpse of the glorified Christ by commemorating it with three tents but the gesture has a hollow ring when they have the Christ with them as a constant reminder. 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' It is the word of Jesus which will bring life and glorification. This glimpse of who Jesus really is should sustain them and yet the disciples still wonder what the mission and ministry of Jesus means.

The true nature of Jesus will only be revealed at his resurrection.

(Continued from page 1) He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.



A DIVINE DESIGN (Matthew 17: 1 - 9)

Jesus was changed before their eyes. Have you ever seen a transfiguration? Have you ever seen a simple thing become a holy thing, like bread become sacred flesh? Have you ever seen a plain face become a radiant beauty when seen through the eyes of love? Have you ever seen a timid person become a loin when circumstances required strength beyond fear? Transfiguration is not an isolated incident, a one-time deal in salvation history. Transfigurations happen around us in surprising places, for those who have eyes to see.

Sitting with my dying friend for many weeks, I watched how a weakened body can become a temple of great holiness. The spiritual strength of a failing mortal life was so much stronger than the physical vigour he once displayed. Before his illness, he scaled mountains for pleasure. In his last illness, he ascended to spiritual heights that astonished me with their breathtaking vistas. Once, he saw the view from the peaks of the Sierras and hoped to climb Mount Kilimanjaro. Now, his vision is on higher places, and the things he sees are lovelier than all of earth's delights. This is transfiguration, as surely as what Peter, James and John saw it on that fateful day.

Ponder


Get ready to participate in some powerful transfigurations! Ask God to change the rough, ugly, or impossible roads in your life into freeways for grace. Invite the Holy Spirit to make the valleys smooth, and the mountains low. "Don't breathe a word of what you've seen. After the Son of Man is raised from the dead, you are free to talk". *GPBS eNews*

DID YOU KNOW?

- The event of the Transfiguration is traditionally associated with Mt Tabor where a beautiful church with magnificent mosaics commemorates this event.
- The three disciples who witness Jesus' glory will be the same ones who witness his agony in the garden prior to his arrest and crucifixion.
- There is great debate among scholars about the meaning of the term 'Son of Man' and whether Jesus used this title of himself or whether his disciples used it of him after his death. In the Book of Daniel, it is used as a term for God's final agent of salvation at the end times.

KIDS' CORNER

The disciples are confused and scared when they hear the voice from the cloud and see Jesus in his glory. But here on the mountain, they are told to listen to Jesus. That's good to remember anytime you're worried or afraid: Listen to what Jesus says to you. Trust that he loves you. Then, like the disciples, you can get up and get moving. You can have courage in God's love for you. *GPBS eNews*
