REDUCTION TO SPEED LIMIT

We recently consulted on the proposal to reduce the speed limit from 50km/h to 30km/h on Old Coach Rd, Aldinga, between Port Rd and Main South Rd. Forty five people provided feedback, which resulted in 80% support for the proposal.

Following this result, we sought formal approval from Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) for the reduction in speed limit on Old Coach Road who has now approved the speed reduction. Installation of new speed signage will be completed by the end of July 2022.

OUR GOD FEAST

Jesus speaks of himself, the One he knows as the Father, and the Friend Spirit interchangeably, at least in the Gospel of John. It can get a little confusing, Jesus and the Father are one, and the Spirit speaks for Jesus. Soon the disciples will share in this same unity with the Spirit comes to dwell with them. How can we tell where one identity leaves and one begins?

We can't. And we don't have to. That's the nature of mystery. God can't be sliced up like a pie and served across the table piece by piece. We want to be scientific, or at least mathematical, about Trinity: How much of Jesus is God? (All of him) Then what's the difference between God and Jesus? (Full humanity) How can Jesus be fully God and fully human? (Good question!) If Eucharist is Jesus, and we consume Eucharist, how much of us is Christ? (As much as we

allow) This last question is the only one that's no mystery at all. It's an invitation awaiting our response.

How much of your life is given over to "being Christ," as the Eucharist invites us to be? What can you do to increase the percentage of your surrender?

Celebrate God the Creator today. Enjoy the beauty of the natural world. Celebrate God the Redeemer in word and sacrament. Celebrate God the Sanctifier in prayer and praise.



COMPLIANCE WITH COVID-19 REGULATIONS

(Current from 08/06/22)



- If you have tested positive for COVID-19, please follow the SA Health instructions in regard to isolating and other government health protocols. Stay home and do not attend church services until you have fully recovered.
- There are now no density limits for places of worship.
- Masks are highly recommended by the Archdiocese.
- Attendees at indoor religious services may sing during worship.
- Please keep in mind the importance of social distancing and good hygiene practices.
- Hand sanitizer is available at Church entrances.
- There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during Mass.
- Offertory procession will be omitted. Communion is given only in hands. Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Collection plates will not be passed around.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.
- The Archdiocese recommends Covid vaccinations for all (please check with your GP if you have concerns).

DID YOU KNOW?

- The early Christians struggled to understand the belief that God is both one and three. Many great councils of the church were held to clarify what this meant and to find the language with which to describe the trinitarian relationship between Father, Son and Spirit. It was not until the Council of Constantinople in ad 381 that the doctrine of the Trinity was defined.
- Many of the prayers of the church express our belief in a triune God (three persons in one). One of the greatest and most simple of these prayers is the sign of the cross.

John 16:12-15

Jesus said to his disciples:

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

Bryan never thought of himself as a spiritual person. He went to church once in a while, especially on Christmas and Easter and during Lent, but he never thought about it much. Now he had come to know the truth about himself and had come to understand that the truth was from God. And the truth about Bryan was that he was an alcoholic.

The truth caught up with Bryan the morning he woke up and didn't know where he was or how he had gotten there. He didn't know what he had done the night before, how the side of his car had gotten bashed in, or why there was a gash in his arm and a bruise on his face. All he remembered was that he had been having a few drinks with his friends and had gotten pretty drunk. Just like the night before, and the night before that. In fact, he had been getting drunk a lot.

But now the truth was upon him and he had to do something about it. At the 12-step meeting, when it was time, he stood up and, for the first time in a long time, he spoke the truth: "My name is Bryan and I'm an alcoholic". In the days and weeks to come, Bryan would learn a lot more truth about himself. But for now, the big truth was that the Spirit of Truth had rescued him. And that from now on he was going to be on God's side, living in the truth.

The Commissioning: You are the change-makers of the Holy One: life will be different and good. You are the peacemakers of the Holy One: conflict and disharmony will be resolved. You are the health-bringers of the Holy One: suffering and sadness will be overcome, the example of Jesus will enthuse us, the Holy Spirit will go with us. Amen.
