

LEBANON CRISIS APPEAL

THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025 PILGRIMS OF HOPE ON THE PATH OF PEACE

Pope Francis has declared 2025 a Jubilee Year and he wants the year to be lived as a 'year of hope' to which has been added by the Dicastery for the Consecrated Life in Rome: 'on the path of peace'. To pray for peace in our world is a call to each of us.

A Jubilee Year has its origins in the Scriptures, but the first one celebrated in Western Christianity, was in the year 1300, when Pope Boniface VII convoked a special year of grace and conversion, involving prayer, pilgrimage and sacramental repentance. The goal of a Jubilee year is to inspire and encourage holiness of life among the faithful and therefore to strengthen the Church's witness to God's loving mercy in and for the



THE ADVENT OF A NEW YEAR

I was terrified to start my first year of high school. While I was excited about the prospect of learning, I was afraid to go forward alone. My classmates from primary school were attending a different high school. I wasn't sure I would make it without the friends I had been with since kindergarten. I was sure my first day of high school would be the end of me.

As the summer holidays wound up, my mum encouraged me to check out a flyer from the soccer team about tryouts. I was a tough defender in other sports, so I figured I'd probably do well in the soccer team about the goal posts. My mum rearranged her schedule so that she could drive me to tryouts and then for practice after I made the team. I spent two weeks running drills with the team before school started. I got to know my teammates and found that a few of us shared the same classes. By the first day of high school, I had a few friends – and even some sports cred.

While it was tough to arrive at the end of what I had known for most of my life, it was also necessary in order for the great new adventure to begin. And people like my mum would be with me, giving me strength and encouragement – and car rides – all along the way.

As we start this first week of Advent, we remember that we go forth not alone but with our faith community. In this season of hope, we can trust that together we will find strength and encouragement for whatever adventures and challenges lie ahead.

PROMISES, PROMISES (*Luke 21:25-28, 34-36*)

When we read end-of-the-world passages in Scripture, we usually focus on destruction unleashed on the unsuspecting world. "Apocalypse now" sounds really scary - and it's supposed to. But not to us believers. Be not afraid is one of the most oft-repeated pieces of advice in


the New Testament. If you're with Jesus, there's nothing to fear, even when the boat is rocking in a violent storm.

Some may die of fright when disaster strikes, whether it's apocalyptic or a mere crisis of modern living. We all know people who die a thousand deaths when the bank account is overdrawn. Fearful living is not faithful living. For believers there's no disaster large enough to be bigger than God's sovereignty. And though at first glance it seems strange to begin Advent and the new church year on such a note, on further examination it is the perfect place to start. We know we're not really waiting the coming of the Christ child but rather the coming of Christ the King (remember, last Sunday?) Redemption is at hand. We have nothing to fear.

KIDS' CORNER

When we're faced with a difficult choice, it would be easier if there were big arrow signs reading: GOD'S WAY. But God's way can't be found on a map. They are found in God's Word, in Jesus and through the Holy Spirit working in our hearts. How do we tune in? Prayer. Spend quiet time with God each day, and you will come to know what God wants for you and from you.
